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Goose Harbour Lake Wind Farm Updates



Construction at the Goose Harbour Lake Wind Farm continues to make excellent progress, with the project remaining on schedule and maintaining an outstanding safety record of more than 440,000 hours worked without a lost-time injury.

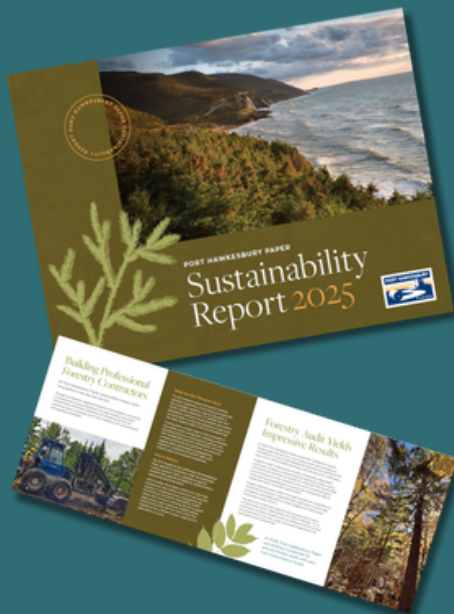
Significant milestones have been reached over the past several weeks:

- All roads are complete
- All 880 transmission line poles have been installed. 80% of all conductors have been strung.

- All wind turbine sets have been delivered to site
- 16 turbines fully assembled and 4 additional towers stacked and ready for completion
- 6 turbines have had their MCC (Mechanical Completion) walkdowns, and 4 turbines have been turned over for commissioning
- The 2 substations are completed and will be energized in August
- Operations & Maintenance building is complete and will receive its Occupancy Permit in the next couple weeks

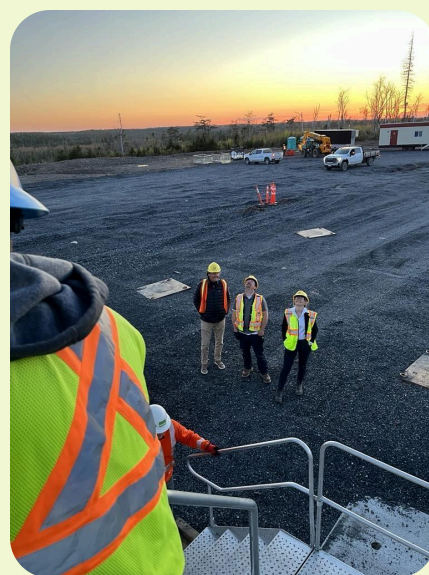

SEC is Proposing a Ruling to Default to Digital Delivery

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) proposed Regulation E-Delivery. The rule would flip the default for certain financial disclosures from paper to digital, requiring consumers to opt back into paper. That includes:

- Brokerage firms
- Mutual fund companies
- Banks
- Trust companies
- Retirement plan administrators

That means issuers of financial information would no longer need

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individual's responsibility to switch back to paper. There is a public comment period until Sept. 21, 2026. This will be a huge hit to both the paper industry and the USPS. Add your voice and get more information from the [AF&PA](#).
